Amends Constitution: Prohibits "highway" (defined) fees/tolls after December 31, 2017, unless voters in nearby counties approve

Result of "Yes" Vote: "Yes" vote amends constitution. After 2017, new "highway" (defined) fees/tolls require voter approval in counties within 15 miles, including planned tolls on I-5, I-205.

Result of "No" Vote: "No" vote retains current law allowing public bodies to collect fees/tolls without voter approval, including planned tolls on I-5, I-205.

Summary: Amends Constitution. Currently, public bodies may collect fees and tolls without voter approval; current law requires tolls be collected on certain sections of I-205 and I-5 in Portland metro area. Measure prohibits public bodies from assessing "any fee or charge for the use of a highway," unless referred for approval or rejection to the electors in each county with a border within a 15-mile radius of any section of "highway" proposed to be tolled and approved by majority of votes cast. Definition of "highway" includes "every public way, road, street, thoroughfare and place, including bridges, viaducts and other structures." "Vehicles" include devices propelled/powered by any means, including bicycles. Measure applies to tolls established after December 31, 2017, including forthcoming I-205 and 1-5 tolls.

New Tolls Require Regional Voter Approval

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

Constitutional amendment means no gubernatorial or legislative overrides

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

PARAGRAPH 1. The Constitution of the State of Oregon is amended by creating a new section 16 to be added to and made a part of Article IX, such section to read:

SECTION 16.

A vote is required BEFORE tolls

- (1) A public body may not assess a toll on a highway in this state unless:
 - (a) The toll was in operation before January 1, 2018; or
 - (b) (A) A toll is proposed by a public body;

Regional vote is required

- (B) The toll proposed by the public body is referred for approval or rejection to the electors of each county in this state that has a county border within a 15-mile radius of any section of highway proposed to be tolled; and
- (C) The toll proposed by the public body is approved by a majority of the total votes cast in the referral described in subparagraph (B) of this paragraph.
- (2) As used in this section:

All highways, roads and bridges

- (a) "Highway" means every public way, road, street, thoroughfare and place, including bridges, viaducts and other structures within the boundaries of this state, open, used or intended for use of the general public for vehicles or vehicular traffic as a matter of right.
- (b) "Public body" means a public body as defined by the laws of this state.
- (c) "Section of highway proposed to be tolled" means the portion of highway beginning at the highway exit before the first toll collection facility and ending at the highway exit after the last toll collection facility, as observed by the direction of vehicle travel on the highway.
- (d) "Toll" means any fee or charge for the use of a highway.
- (e) "Toll collection facility" means any physical location at which a toll is charged to vehicles for using the highway, including a toll booth, toll plaza or electronic toll collection system.

All vehicles: cars, trucks, bicycles

(f) (A) "Vehicle" means any device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a public highway.

Powered by gasoline, electricity, feet or any other means

(B) "Vehicle" includes vehicles that are propelled or powered by any means.

TOLLS ARE COMING as a primary ODOT revenue source Tolling all Across Oregon is ODOT's plan.

IP-4 requires a VOTE <u>BEFORE</u> TOLLS!

- ODOT wants a new source of revenue, a new tax ... Tolling is in addition to the current gasoline tax plus a <u>new</u> miles-driven tax (RUC) (2021 HB-2342)
- <u>Bipartisan</u> State Legislative votes got us in this mess ... In 2017 Salem mandated congestion tolls for parts of I-5 & I-205 in Portland. The tolling target area was expanded in 2021, and last year we heard ODOT say "all of Oregon".
- ODOT is seeking to opportunistically toll roads and bridges throughout Oregon wherever there is a key river, bridge, or mountain choke point with no alternative route.
 - Tolling collection overhead is 30-60% ... half the funds never see a project!
 - Tolls are not necessarily connected to improved roads and DO NOT SUNSET

The politicians got us into this mess – they are NOT getting us out of it!

IP-4 puts control back with the citizens ... by requiring a Vote Before Tolls.

- IP-4 requires a regional vote before new tolls anywhere in the state
- It's a **constitutional amendment** so the Legislators can't decide for a third time to expand tolling without the voter's permission
- Covers all roads, bridges, highways, interstates, and viaducts, and all vehicles ...
 cars, motorcycles, trucks, and even bicycles
- In short, IP-4 will force ODOT to be transparent about the use of toll funds before voters will approve new tolls.
